## **CMG picks up Legend library and strikes Benelux deal**

The library encompasses more than 50 newly restored titles by San Diego-based Legend Films, including George A Romero's *Night Of The Living Dead* and Roger Corman's *The Little Shop Of Horrors*.

Also featuring are Ed Wood's *Plan Nine From Outer Space*, John Wayne titles *The Outlaw* and *Stolen Goods*, Laurel & Hardy's *March Of The Wooden Soldiers*, Merian C Cooper's sci-fi classic *She*, and eight Shirley Temple pictures.

"These features provide wonderful entertainment and we are pleased to release them on an international level, which for many of these films will be for the first time," Noeltner said. "We are thrilled to be representing these outstanding classic films and to be in business with RCV Entertainment, one of the top distributors in the Benelux, who will be releasing the titles starting early next year."

CMG's slate includes Tribeca winner *The Treatment*, and the entire Moriah Films documentary slate.
